Answer: Frederick Douglass

Q: Gave “The Composite Nation” speech in 1869 in advocating for a multi-racial America, and against the exclusion of Chinese and other Asians.



Answer: 1882

Q: The year the Chinese Exclusion Act was passed.



Answer: 39,579

Q: The number of Chinese people who entered the U.S. in 1882.*



Answer: 10

Q: The number of legally admitted Chinese people, five years after the Exclusion Act.*



Answer: 1907 to 1934

Q: The years other laws and rules were passed to exclude other Asian groups including Japanese, Koreans and Filipinos from immigration.*



Answer: Judy Chu

Q: Authored House Resolution 683 that formally expresses the regret of the House of Representatives for the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882 and other legislation that
